Pastor's Perspective

On Sunday, April 16th Peace Church made the decision to invest in a solar power system that is projected to cut our annual electricity bill by 86%. That's a lot of savings, and for some the most attractive aspect of our decision. After all, stewardship of our finances is very important.

Yet perhaps even more important to our solar investment is the impact it will have on God's green earth. Only a few short years ago, people like me and many others wondered about the reality of climate change and its impact on the earth. I needed more tangible proof and scientific knowledge of the entire process. Today I am not only an informed "believer" in climate change, but have been following the climate disruptions (fires, floods, hurricanes, droughts, & extreme temperatures) that are now routinely taking place all over the world. Additionally, the current levels of CO2 in the air are higher than ever before reaching 424.83 parts per million (ppm) two weeks ago on April 17th (see www.co2.earth). With the sustainable level determined to be at 350 ppm, this is not a good development.

While our investment in 100 solar panels is the equivalent of a drop of water into the ocean, we are simply one of a global movement of people, organizations, corporations, and governments all over the world who are making the move to renewable energy. Like it or not, the change has begun and the only remaining question is whether or not we can make the change quickly enough. 

UCC General Synod 34 Indianapolis, Indiana June 30th - July 4th

Every two years the United Church of Christ has its national meeting called the General Synod. This is the meeting where representatives of all UCC bodies (local churches, regional Conferences, national instrumentalities, and global ministries)



meet to do the business of the church. This year, such business includes the election of a new denominational President, a proposal to meet every three years instead of two, and various resolutions dealing with a variety of issues facing the church in these times.

Delegates are sent from every UCC conference (there are 38) in the nation and this year Pastor Tom Warren has been invited to be a voting delegate of the Southern Conference. He will travel to Indianapolis on June 30th and travel home on July 5th. His expenses will be paid by the Southern Conference.

The most exciting vote this year will be for our new denominational President. After a year-long process, the UCC National Board voted March 4th to nominate Associate General Minister, the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, for General Minister and President. If elected by the General Synod this summer, Thompson would be the first woman and the first woman of African descent — to lead the denomination.

We will have more General Synod news in June's Peace Press, but please keep our denominational leaders in your prayers as the planning for General Synod 34 proceeds.
